

#### Precision Micropower Shunt Voltage Reference in bare die form

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#### Description

The LM4040A-4.1 is a high precision, two-terminal shunt mode, bandgap voltage reference with fixed reverse breakdown voltage of 4.096V. The device is ideal for space-critical high reliability applications with initial 0.1% accuracy and 100ppm/°C max temperature coefficient. A 68µA to 15mA shunt current capability with low dynamic impedance ensures stable reverse breakdown voltage accuracy over a wide current range and operating temperature. No external stabilizing capacitors are required.







### **Typical Application**



An external series resistor (R<sub>S</sub>) is connected between the supply voltage, V<sub>S</sub>, and the LM4040A.

 $R_{\rm S}$  determines the current that flows through the load ( $I_{\rm L}$ ) and the LM4040A ( $I_{\rm R}$ ). Since load current and supply voltage may vary,  $R_{\rm S}$  should be small enough to supply at least the minimum acceptable  $I_{\rm R}$  to the LM4040A even when the supply voltage is at its minimum and the load current is at its maximum value. When the supply voltage is at its maximum and  $I_{\rm L}$  is at its minimum,  $R_{\rm S}$  should be large enough so that the current flowing through the LM4040A is less than 15mA.

 $R_S$  is determined by the supply voltage,  $(V_S)$ , the load and operating current,  $(I_L$  and  $I_R)$ , and the LM4040A's reverse breakdown voltage,  $V_R$ .

$$R_S = \frac{V_S - V_R}{I_L + I_R}$$

<sup>2.</sup> Reverse Breakdown Tolerance is defined as the room temperature Reverse Breakdown Voltage Tolerance  $\pm[(\Delta V_R/\Delta T)(max\Delta T)(V_R)]$ . Where,  $\Delta V_R/\Delta T$  is the  $V_R$  temperature coefficient,  $max\Delta T$  is the maximum difference in temperature from the reference point of 25°C to  $T_{MIN}$  or  $T_{MAX}$ , and  $V_R$  is the reverse breakdown voltage. 3. Load regulation is measured on pulse basis from no load to the specified load current. Output changes due to die temperature change must be taken into account separately. Thermal hysteresis is defined as the difference in voltage measured at +25°C after cycling to temperature -40°C and the 25°C measurement after cycling to temperature +125°C.

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
